ABOUT THE PIECE:

Não aou eu quem deacrevo is part of a series where I relentlessly steal from and «modify» other composers works. This piece derives from Morton Feldman's «For Aaron Copland», a short solo violin piece. I've stolen the rhytmical structure (stretched out in time), and its tones (which are gradually replaced by multiphonics).

The piece consists of nothing but long drawn out tones, making the quartet blend together as one single instrument. Added to this is a rather intense consentration around close dyad multiphonics, which creates small microtonal frictions resulting in beatings and vibrations, especially when blended with normal tones.

PERFORMANCE NOTES:

- The piece is prefereably performed in a church (or similar venue with long reverb)
- All multiphonics are from Marcus Weiss: *The techniquea of aaxophone playing.* All multiphonics with fingerings are summarized on next page. Fingerings are also given in the score, and numbers in brackets corresponds to numbers given in Weiss' book.
- Generally, all multiphnics should be soft.
- It is important that the instruments blend together as much as possible. Generally, strive for a sinetone or organ like quality of tone.
- No vibrato at all

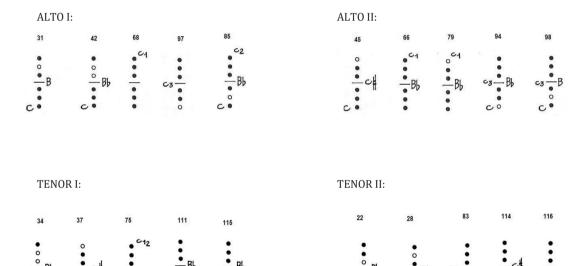
